

"Why is everyone always mad at me?" thought nine-year-old Isabella. "Everywhere I go, people get upset with me." Although it was a bold statement that wasn't true all the time, it was true much of the time for Isabella. It wasn't that she did something major that caused others to be angry with her; it was that she would do little things that bothered others. Those "little things" seemed to go a long way to cause negative consequences.

At home, Isabella struggled to stop interrupting her mom when there was a phone call or text conversation going on. Because of her rude behavior, she wasn't allowed to watch movies or TV for a week. Her teacher sent a note home from school stating that Isabella was given extra homework because she was getting up and down in class without permission and had missed assignments. When she was at a birthday party with her friends, Isabella felt jealous of all the nice gifts her friend received so she went and pouted in another room. Two girls came in and called her a "selfish baby" then started laughing.

Even on her basketball team Isabella had trouble. Her coach said she had to run more laps because she had purposely shoved a girl down in anger during warm ups. It seemed everywhere she went there were big issues that came from little things she was doing. But one day, Isabella heard a message at church about little things making a big difference. The lesson was about God taking something small and turning it into something big. She was more interested in this message than ever before. She knew that in the past her little actions always went a long way to get her into trouble and heartache. But, this seemed different.

The leader kept joyfully repeating a tiny phrase all through the lesson, "A little every day goes a long, long way!" She taught that in Matthew 13:32 Jesus explained to a crowd of people how a tiny mustard seed grew into a massive garden plant.

God always takes your small acts of obedience and turns them into His big plan.

"Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches." She told the group that Jesus told this parable to describe how the kingdom of God works. The girls learned that when they chose to do the little things that are

God's ways, He would turn them into big blessings!

"That's it!" Isabella thought with excitement. "I want a little every day to go a long, long way with me too! But I want it to be used for God, not for my own ways." For the first time in months, Isabella could see how her own little actions were causing big frustrations with others. Now she wanted to start doing little things that would cause big blessings.

The church leader continued by showing the class a garden picture. She explained that when a seed is planted in a garden and nurtured, the plant will bloom. She went on to compare how that could apply to the girls' lives as well. The leader shared, "When you plant God's seeds in your everyday choices, a little every day goes a long, long way. The beginning may seem small and meaningless, but when life-seeds are sown and nurtured they eventually bloom! God always takes your small acts of obedience and turns them into His big plan. There is nothing too little that He can't develop or use. Little becomes much when you give Him every part of your life."

And that was the day Isabella prayed a simple prayer that changed her life. When she went to bed that night, she wholeheartedly prayed, "God, I am sorry. Please forgive me for following my own ways. I give You my life with all the little things in it, so You can use my life for Your big plans. Help me to nurture the seeds You plant so I can bloom." By the time she woke up, Isabella was ready for a new start. She said to herself as she began a new journey, "Today I am going to sow God's seeds in what I do and see what He does! A little every day goes a long, long way!"

"A little every day goes a long, long way. A little every day goes a long, long way. A little every day goes a long, long way" was a cliché Kelly would hear over and over at home as she was growing up. Although hearing it sometimes annoyed her, now that she was a teenager she was thankful she had listened to those words of advice. It seemed that every aspect of Kelly's life had been influenced by that one phrase. "A little every day goes a long, long way" would come to Kelly's mind at the most random but necessary times. It was as if that one life-insight affected everything.

When it came time to hang up her clothes or put away her school items after

a long day, Kelly knew that "a little every day goes a long, long way" would keep her room clean and functional.

For health decisions, choosing wisely to exercise was affected by "a little every day goes a long, long way." She enjoyed feeling good and looking her best because she made the right decisions daily to work out.

In her friendships, being kind and showing love over and over no matter what her friends where facing allowed for deep and meaningful connections to be made.

In school classes, preparing for tests wasn't stressful if Kelly worked on her

reading and memorization a little every day. Studying regularly in small increments of time added up to big rewards with her grades. That tiny phrase "a little every day goes a long, long way" proved to be true in several areas of her life.

In Matthew 13:32, Jesus talked about this principle that applies to everyone's life. He explained to a crowd how a tiny mustard seed grows into a massive garden plant. "Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden

plants and becomes a tree. so that the birds come and perch in its branches." He gave this analogy to describe how God works. The Early Church started out small, but as people shared the gospel a little every day the church grew. The kingdom of God was planted and nurtured by

God's people, and over time, it flourished!

When you plant God's seeds, a little every day goes a long, long way. The beginning may seem small and meaningless but when life-seeds are sown and nurtured, they will eventually bloom! God always takes your small acts of obedience and turns them into His big plan. There is nothing too little that He can't develop or use. Little becomes much when you give Him every part of your life.

In Kelly's relationship with God, a little every day went a long, long way as well. As she took time daily to turn her heart to the Lord, she was developing into a godly young woman. Whether it was starting her day with a worship song, praying for the fruit of the Spirit as she interacted with others, being led of the Spirit in daily decisions, or reading her Bible before bed to grow in wisdom, she was doing little things over and over to build her relationship with God.

The small seeds she had sown into her walk with Him were being nurtured and she was blossoming! Little had become much as she had grown from a little girl who was just learning about God into a flourishing teenager. Her consistent, faithful actions helped her to develop a deep, solid lifestyle of faith. The future is bright for Kelly as she continues to do a little every day in God's work of sowing, nurturing, and blooming!

Celebration

Use "Bloom, when little becomes much" as a theme during your annual Celebration Service. Have girls share the importance of growth and the steps it takes to bloom. Have girls share their personal story of how sowing and nurturing led to blooming for Jesus. There are many ideas for decorations found online.

Girls Night or Retreat

Plan a special evening or overnight event to share thoughts from the theme. New Devotional Journals-one for elementary and one for teen girls-are available. Give each girl a Devotional Journal as a takeaway from the retreat. Set up a craft table and have the girls make the sunflower craft or flower pen from the National Event Planning Guide. Girls can make a keepsake that contains all or part of the verse for Bloom, when little becomes much.

Leader Group or Event

The quality of a good leader is someone who continues to grow. A leader who continues the same will see the same results each year,

but a leader who is sowing and nurturing will begin to see new results. A great gift to give leaders is the Bloom 3-Bar Necklace. It can be a reminder of the theme and the actions they should be doing daily - sow, nurture, bloom. Decorate with lots of flowers for a "Bloom, when little becomes much" look. Set up stations for girls and leaders to mentor and exhibit the meaning of what it means to bloom and become much.

Girls Ministries Week is the second week in September, 10-16, and is the official kickoff of the Annual Theme for the 2017-2018 school year. This year's theme is Bloom, when little becomes much. This is a designated opportunity to increase awareness, visibility, understanding, and enthusiasm for Girls Ministries in your church and community. This may be a good week to have a special event, a girls' night out, or girls outreach. Here are some ideas to help you get started.

Planning

2 months before

• Check with your pastor about placing a National Girls Ministries Week service on the calendar, the possibility of presenting Girls Ministries during a service or a directed Girls Ministries prayer time.

imeline

- Another option if you are unable to have a service is to see if you can set up a booth outside the sanctuary promoting Girls Ministries and discipleship to girls. (Remember, Girls Ministries promotional resources are available in the catalog.)
- Ask to show the new promo video.

1 month before

• With your pastor's approval, arrange for a speaker for your National Girls Ministries Week service. • Provide the theme verse, Matthew 13:32, to the speaker as a suggested topic or the Girls Ministries new promotional video (available in English and Spanish).

2 weeks before

- Pray with your girls and sponsors concerning the National Girls Ministries Week service and offering.
- Display the National Girls Ministries



Week Poster. • Have girls decorate offering containers to be used to receive the National Girls Ministries Week offering.

Select girls to be greeters and ushers.

of service or other pertinent National Girls Ministries Week

information for your church bulletin. Basic information about NGM Week is found on page 11.

• Hand out the flyer for girls and leaders to participate in Girls Ministries Spirit Week. (See the Girls Ministries Spirit Week flyer found on ngm.org under events).

Before the service

• Girls can serve as greeters, distributing a printed program listing all of the service participants along with their club level and perhaps a short bio.

Special presentation suggestions

- Girls can purchase and download the new song "Shine" and have them come up with a human video or motions to perform on stage. The song can be found at s1.ag.org/ shinesong
- If you want to tie in the Sleepover theme and Coins for Kids (CFK) project, a video and reproducible handouts about the current project,

 Allow each club (or just one club) to sing its club theme song. Theme Songs CD (item 28MY5084), recorded in English and Spanish, is available from *My Healthy Church.
